Two Healing Testimonies from St Michaels Remuera prayer group

1.A lady, a declared Buddhist, came to my place to help with some tasks. When she said she had a painful neck, I asked if she'd like a little prayer. She agreed and as I finished, with a shy expression, she made the tiniest little Sign of the Cross. Faith! When we met again, two weeks later, I asked how her neck was. She looked at me in surprise as if to say, "Don't you know!" and said, "All the pain left when you prayed for me."

2. Some years back a Hindu lady, a great talker, was holding me up from getting to work. She had a very painful knee and I thought she could possibly lose her job if the knee did not improve as she couldn't manage her tasks. To my shame, partly in order to get free of her, although I was also concerned about her welfare, I asked if she'd like me to ask Jesus, the Christian healer, the Great Physician, to bring her some relief. I didn't see her again for some months. She wanted to tell me how everyone was talking about a man around at that time, who people were saying was the greatest healer. "I told them they were wrong, "she said. "I told them that the greatest healer was YOU! Once again, I reiterated that Jesus is the Healer. It is His power flowing through us, not our power. It's His gift that is waiting to be drawn upon if we are willing to be led by faith.

We remember, too, that sometimes Jesus heals in other ways, and that sometimes His answer is No to our request. He always knows best.

Another great testimony of God's healing

power. Denis Jacobs testimony, about meeting Jesus and being freed from alcoholism and suicidal tendencies when he received prayer for the anointing of the Holy Spirit at an Alpha weekend.

Some updates from Helen, CharisNZ chairperson

Two take aways from CHARIS Worldwide Intercession Conference

- The importance of silence and contemplation in order to hear what the Lord is saying/asking
- The importance of not being so structured that there is no room for the Holy Spirit to move within our agenda for meetings/gatherings/ conferences.

I see a need for Intercession training as it is foundational to everything else, also Prayer Ministry training as more of our Churches are offering Prayer Ministry after Mass.

Re HUMAN PROMOTION: I met with Brother James Shin (Coordinator of Human Promotion) at the Malaysian Continental



Service of Communion meeting and then again at the CHARIS Worldwide Intercessors Conference Ivory Coast. Since then his counterpart in Australia - Brother James Yu has been in touch and intends to meet Josephine in New Zealand. Bro James Yu of Kkottongae is reaching out to the homeless in Parramatta and preparing to open a small soup kitchen in one of the poorest areas there after he was invited to the diocese by the Bishop of Parramatta, West Sydney, last year.

The Kkottongnae community was founded in Korea in the 1970s by Father John Oh Woong Jin, after he met a homeless man collecting food for a second sick homeless man. It now operates in 10 countries outside Korea.
